It is important to make an appointment

either online or on the form that is enclosed with the reports. If you do not have internet access please request an interview using the booking slip and return it to the "L.A.G" teacher.

- Interviews are 8 minutes long with 2 minutes travelling time.
- I encourage you to bring your students along to hear the comments made and the forward steps that need to be taken.
- I encourage those of you who can come to the interviews during the normal school day to do so as there will be a rush from those who can only come after work.
- The teachers will be based in their classrooms. A map will be provided on the back of the interview form.
- NB: If you have not made an appointment you CANNOT just turn up. Please contact the school and we will set up an alternative time suitable to both you and the teacher.
- Enclosed with your child's report is a letter asking your employer to support you by allowing you to attend the interview during normal work hours!

Well done to our small team of runners that competed in this event. Thank you to Mr Budgen for organising the day.


Rippa Rugby
