Gateway

Gateway is a programme where senior students work for local employers in industries and

occupations they wish to learn more about, with the possibility of pursuing the job for future employment. The Gateway programme strengthens pathways for students to further education, training and employment. Students and employers sign a contract, and the student commits to working for 8 hours (1 day a week for 10 weeks). They also may have access to Unit Standards relevant to the job. This programme has taken over from traditional work experience options for seniors. Any students interested in undertaking the programme should see Mr Willoughby, the Gateway Coordinator, although students are encouraged to settle back into before school undertaking а placement. has Gateway occasionally led to apprenticeship opportunities, and full time employment, and is definitely a good option for seniors thinking about their future plans and goals. Understanding NCEA

There will be an information evening for all parents about NCEA on Wednesday, 11th February 2015. The evening is designed to give parents information about how NCEA works, how students earn credits, ways that parents and students can track progress, how students gain Literacy and Numeracy and the requirements for students wishing to gain University Entrance.

During the evening there will also be information about the parent portal which is an excellent way to track your child's progress.

The evening runs from 6pm to 7pm. Light refreshments will be provided. Spot prize of a school jacket on the night.

Year 10 Achievement Certificate

This year, all Year 10 students will be aiming to achieve a Year 10 Achievement Certificate. This is modelled in the same style as NCEA and is designed to introduce students to the language and workings of NCEA so they are best prepared for Year 11. Every student will be completing common assessment tasks, called APPS tasks (Achievement, Progress, Potential, Success) throughout the year allowing careful tracking of students. Students will be graded, like NCEA, as Achieved, Merit or Excellence.

Please talk to your child about the APPS tasks for this term and how you can support their learning.

The Big Question for this term is 'How do we reduce the level of Conflict in our Society?' This topic was inspired by the 100 year anniversary of the Gallipoli Landings. It may also encompass modern day conflicts and conflict closer to home like bullying, racism, poverty, religion. If you have any family stories or experiences of conflict, I am sure that your child would appreciate your contribution.
