newsletter the data was as follows:

83 proof of being fully vaccinated

• 394 say they are vaccinated but we have no proof

#### 223 are either un-vaccinated or we don't know.

Based on information from the MOE and DHB if we get an outbreak all those who cannot prove they are fully vaccinated may have to be quarantined (At home) including staff. If you have documentary evidence of immunization please urgently supply it to the College Office. (Sue or Susan)

#### **Energy Drinks**

Countdown has introduced an age restriction on energy drinks from Monday 2 September, which means that customers will need to be 16 years or older to buy these products in our stores.

New Zealand has the third highest obesity rate in the OECD. Energy drinks are not recommended for children, and they have to carry a warning on the can or bottle saving this. Countdown talked with a range of health leaders and overwhelmingly, the feedback we received was that when it came to children's health, restricting the sale of energy drinks would make an important and meaningful impact. Specifically it was the combination of high-sugar, highcaffeine, serving sizes and the fact drinks are often that energy consumed on the way to school that was highlighted to us.

So from Monday 2 September, our team may ask anyone who looks under 16 for their ID.
