Super Tuesday Police Studies Course



Senior students on the Super Tuesday Police Studies course have found themselves truly tried and tested over the past few months. The Police Studies programme, run in conjunction with the New Zealand Police, gives students the chance to achieve the Learning Preparation course that new police recruits must pass before attending The Royal New Zealand Police College. Whilst this course is traditionally offered to new recruits via Distance Learning, this hands-on initiative is



approach that is being trialled in Secondary Schools. Waihi College was fortunate enough to be invited to get involved: students from Katikati College are also attending. The programme, which offers 24 Level 3 credits, prepares students for a career in the police force. Aspects covered include fitness (the entry requirements are very pathways, demanding!), career communication and interviewing skills, and responding to incidents and crime scenes. Every week the course is supported by police officers - we are so very grateful to Senior Constable David Grant, Community Constable Harley North, Constable Melissa Whiteman and Constable Tracey Lemon for all the time and energy they are putting into our students' growth

and development. As well as providing valuable programme content, these constables have become the students' mentors and friends. Personal Trainer and Wellness Coach Victoria Lemon, who specialises in preparing candidates for the Police Physical Appraisal Tests, has also been working with the students on their fitness, goal setting and mind mapping as they approach fresh challenges.

Volunteering experience is an essential for a successful police application – and because of this the course includes an introduction to Lifeguarding, the Fire Brigade and Search and Rescue. Students will get the opportunity to attend the Blue Light Police/Defence Force Leadership Camp in August, and to sit their Lifeguard or Patrol Support exam in September.

It's fair to say that so far, the course has challenged everyone involved. Our students have been tested physically and mentally, our local



constables are doing a great job with the teaching, and everyone has realised that the more they commit, the greater the reward. Kate Morley
