MATTERS ARISING FROM THE LAST MINUTES		Achievement Data Pete: We were going to invite our SLT to tonight's meeting to report on Achievement Data, however given the current COVID 19 situation, their focus has been on getting prepared for a possible move to L3 and delivery of subjects to students from home. We will look to invite SLT to our next meeting.		

Scott: Can we make sure we have enough digital tech for students? Any idea how we are looking with this?

Dot: We acknowledge the importance of our seniors having a device to work on if we go back to working from home. If it was known to us that seniors didn't have a device or WiFi,, the school had pre-prepared paper copies (on Friday 14 August in case of an announcement to move to Alert Level 3). Plans are now in place so that we are ready to go and those who need support have been identified.

Pete: If we shift to L3, it was discussed that our support staff will deliver hard copies to homes.

Scott: Is there a challenge with students not engaging?

Dot: There was at the beginning of the year (first lockdown), but I think the biggest challenge nationwide was mental health. That was a priority. Now, seniors are well on their way. They are more motivated and focused on 'how can we get there'.

Pete: How is the anxiety of our students? Let's continue to keep prepping and hope we don't need to go down that route again.

Pastoral Data  Dot: Interesting data. Mostly female, ⅓
Maori/Pasifika, the rest European.
Swimming Pool Tess and Shane are meeting with Alistair tomorrow regarding the upgrade to the swimming pool change rooms.  Scott: What paperwork do we have which confirms our school's agreement with the council?  Pete: The council are responsible for the swimming pool running costs, Waihi College are responsible for the running costs of the change rooms. The council are aware of the improvements that are about to be done by the Waihi Swimming Club and Waihi College. There have been discussions about the Council upgrading their safety signs etc, as this is one of their responsibilities.  It was agreed that Pete will ask to sight the standing agreement for the swimming pool between Hauraki District Council and Waihi College. Pete understands this was a verbal agreement between the school and the council dating back many years.

Translations / Signage:  Dot: Spoke with Whaea Tuihana regarding the translations. Tuihana reported that students have been working on this, and the ideas were currently on pieces of paper. Dot suggested these students ideas were passed onto Scott, which will give him a starting point. Dot explained to the BoT that when something is built into students' learning, it's a process. It appears there has been some miscommunication around the time sensitive nature of getting the signs completed.  Scott: Has received some ideas from the students now which was great to see. He now has some translations, may need some clarification.	
Uniform: Kookie: Has the change in uniform shorts been communicated to whanau yet?  Kyla: I think some students are wearing the sport shorts, others are still wearing the uniform shorts.  Confirmed: Sport shorts are acceptable to be worn as uniform shorts effective immediately. Alistair to communicate this to school staff and school community. GENERAL BUSINESS	Website update Scott / Alex Scott: Have had a meeting with Jeff, Wendy, Alistair, Alex. We have decided to delay the launch slightly as it is still not populated enough. It's worth doing properly, and it could coincide nicely with our new signage.  Who does the work is critical. Wendy has been allocated additional hours for this. She will develop a relationship with Jade Creative, so she can liaise directly with them regarding questions etc. The journey is getting everything linked (newsletters, communication etc), and maneuvering everything and everyone into the site.  Rachael will require some training for the sports page.  Having the right 'tone of voice' is important, to get our message across.  The Digital Noticeboard is able to be changed on a daily basis.  There is an investment involved in training people (time).
